Advanced editing is used to create illusions, deceptions, and/or manipulations, and the adding and removing of significant elements within the frame is prohibited. Objectionable pictures portraying nudity, pictures with the potential threat to communal harmony, OR pictures outraging the modesty of women or children shall be considered for disqualification without any intimation to the participants.

Rules and Regulations for Gokulashtami SportsEvents: 2023

I. URIYADI COMPETITION FOR MEN:

- 1. A team consists of 10 members. Each of them will hit the pot only in their turn.
- 2. In each round, there will be a maximum of 3 pots.
- 3. SCORING: (Maximum duration: 3 Minutes) the time taken to break each pot will be noted. The shortest time and the maximum number of pots broken will decide the winning team.
- 4. The participants should not throw the stick to break the pot. If he does it, that will be considered foul.
- 5. If the participants commit a foul, their chances will be over. That pot will not be taken into consideration for scoring.
- 6. The participants will begin the game only after the whistle is blown.
- 7. When each pot is broken the timekeeper will stop the watch and note the time. The stopwatch will not be reset till the third pot is broken or at the end of three minutes, whichever is earlier.
- 8. Two Teams will be selected based on best timings (Winner and Runner).
- 9. Prizes will be given to the Winner and Runner Teams.

II. POLE CLIMBING (MEN):

- 1. A pole is fixed vertically and at a particular point on the pole, an object will be hung.
- 2. The participant has to climb and touch the object.
- 3. The time taken to touch the object will be noted.
- 4. Each participant will be given only one chance.
- 5. Participants with minimum timing will be the winner.
- 6. Three prizes (i.e.,) I, II, and III will be given.

III. TUG OF WAR (MEN & WOMEN):

- 1. A team will consist of 8 members.
- 2. Knock-out System will be followed with only one chance in the initial rounds and three chances will be given in the final round.

3. Prizes will be given to the Winner and Runner Teams.

IV. LUCKY CORNER (WOMEN):

- 1. There will be a circle that is divided into 8 parts & numbered from 1 to 8.
- 2. At the first whistle, the participants should move around the circle.

3. At the second whistle, they can choose any of the numbers to stand on. The announcer will say one of the numbers within the circle.

- 4. The participants in that particular number will be out of the contest.
- 5. This process continues until the first three positions are selected.
- 6. Three prizes (i.e.,) I, II and III prizes will be given.
