**An In-depth Study of Paninian Grammar

**Course Outcome:**

CO1: Proficiency with Samjna and Paribhasha's concepts, particularly how they are categorized and important terms in Paninian grammar.

CO5: Learning how the Sanskrit prefixes Krt (primary) and Taddhita (secondary) form and function, as well as how to analyze and interpret sentences that contain them.

Unit I: संज्ञा परिभाषा च (Samjna & Paribhasha)

Utilization of Samjna and Paribhasha.

Samjna classification and attributes.

An examination of important definitions and jargon.

Unit II: पञ्चसन्धयः (Pancha Sandhis)

An explanation of Sanskrit grammar's five different kinds of Sandhi (junctions).

Textual analysis involves the identification and implementation of Sandhi norms.

Exercises that are applicable to Sandhi resolution.

Unit III: कारकं स्त्रीप्रत्ययाश्च (Karaka & Stri Pratyaya)

Understanding and application of the concept of Karaka (semantic roles) and Stri Pratyaya (feminine suffixes).

Analysis of Karaka categories and their functions in sentence construction.

Application of Karaka theory in parsing and interpreting Sanskrit sentences.

Unit IV: समासवृत्तिः (Samasa)

Detailed study of compound formation in Sanskrit grammar.

Classification and analysis of different types of compounds (Samasa).

Practical exercises on identifying and analyzing compound formations.

Unit V: कृत्-तद्धितप्रत्ययाः (Krt & Taddhita Suffixes)

Study of Krt (primary suffixes) and Taddhita (secondary suffixes).

Analysis of the formation and functions of Krt and Taddhita forms in Sanskrit.  
Practical exercises on parsing and interpreting sentences containing Krt and Taddhita suffixes.
