

Intelligent behaviour is the capacity to make judgments in unique circumstances based on one's understanding of the world: individuals behave intelligently if they utilize what they know to obtain what they desire. When I hear news about 'AI' these days, I think of algorithms for pattern recognition and approximations of complicated functions, most notably Machine Learning. Product personalization, fraud detection, credit risk modelling, insurance pricing, medical picture analysis, and self-driving vehicles are just a few examples of fantastic Machine Learning applications. However, AI began as an area of study that attempted to address a far more fundamental question:

The Genesis of intelligent behaviour?

Intelligent behaviour is the capacity to make judgments in unique circumstances based on one's understanding of the world: individuals behave intelligently if they utilize what they know to obtain what they desire. Al research is based on the idea that intelligence is inherently computational. As a result, we can devise techniques to reproduce it in machines. Conclusion: Accurate intelligence requires more than just pattern recognition.

Elaine Herzberg was riding her bike crossing a roadway in Tempe, Arizona, on March 18, 2018, when she was tragically struck by an Uber self-driving vehicle. The data did not include people jay-walking or pedestrians pulling a bike across a street, as it was discovered later after the car's core system had been trained on hours and hours of driving data. In addition, Herzberg was not classified as a pedestrian by the car's computer vision system; thus, it did not attempt to stop.

This terrible anecdote highlights the long-tail issue in Machine Learning. While driving a vehicle, there are so many diverse situations and edge cases, so many that training a machine learning system to recognize and categorize all of them are difficult, if not impossible. Even if the AI driving the automobile does a great job 99.9% of the time, that 0.1% of the time when it has no understanding of what was going on might be deadly. Consider the following scenarios: freezing rain, whiteouts, earthquakes, a bird crashing through the windshield, or a coffee table falling from the vehicle in front of you.

Pattern recognition alone cannot teach all intelligent behaviour. When we humans are confronted with a completely new circumstance, we may depend on our common sense to guide us. True AI is all about this kind of intelligence. Machine Learning-based AI systems are inherently constrained by the patterns they've encountered throughout their training phase. This proves to us that Machine Learning and Artificial intelligence, despite being massive inventions, still have a long way to go before they're able to imitate the intelligence and mastery of the human mind.

Many of you might be aware of the 'Wheat grain and the Chessboard story'. If not, it goes like this-Once upon a time, a proud king offers his priest a price in return for solving a challenge, the priest is allowed to ask for any of the materialistic riches present in this world provided that he solves the king's puzzle. The clever priest in return solves the puzzle and plans to show his prowess by asking for a specific bounty. He asks the Highness to place one grain of wheat on the first square of the chessboard, two on the second square, four on the third, eight on the fourth, and so on till the sixty-fourth square. He asks the king to donate the final amount of wheat to him. The king orders his ministers to do so. However, it turns out in the end that on the sixty-fourth square, there are approximately 9.22*10^18 wheat grains! This exceeded the total amount of treasure stored in the entire kingdom!

This story makes it quite clear that chess is not an ordinary game, its origin is of paramount significance in history. The chess we know now is the successor of the game Chaturanga which is traced back to almost 1500 years. A time period quite hard and ancient to imagine. The name gives the impression that it originated in India but before it came to its present form, it toured across Persia, the Muslim world and Europe in the 19th century. This journey of the game divided it into two types namely, Indo-Arabic and International chess (present game). Some distinguishable factors include the movement of the Queen, which is considered to be the most powerful piece on the board. Unlike in the present game, in the earlier versions the Queen had movement allowed to only one square diagonally, this made it a very vulnerable piece.

One can never get bored of playing chess simply because it never repeats itself, every game is unique. This is stated literally because there are 400 possible positions after playing the first move, 72,084 unique possible positions after the second movie, and so on as you can imagine. This humanmade marvel became universal after the formation of the World chess federation in the 20th century. This in turn, gave rise to numerous grandmasters, their bots, and a plethora of opportunities to players around the globe. The longest possible chess game theoretically ends in 5949 moves, but the game per se will never stop reigning over the hearts of millions of chess lovers across the world.



Moreover, the mindset that said "Being introverted is the most peaceful thing" no longer exists, thus I came to be the extrovert that I am today.







My club will never walk alone. When then-Liverpool captain Steven Gerrard and then-Liverpool manager Sir Kenny Dalglish raised the League Cup at the magnificent Wembley Stadium in London, my association with the club began. I was 12 years old then and the club will be celebrating its 130th birthday this June, so my love affair with the Liverpool football club approaches its tenth year. Liverpool FC is a historic club that takes pleasure in being European Royalty, having won the Champions League six times more than any other English team and tied for third-most overall. As this Merseyside club approaches its 130th birthday, we'll take a closer look at the club's history, beginning with its founding.

I'm sure a lot of people are asking what Merseyside is! Liverpool is a city in Merseyside, which is a county in Northwest England. Now that we've covered geography, let's return to football in England, where the Football League First Division was established in 1888. Everton Football Club was one of the 12 clubs that made up the initial division.


Everton Football Club is a Liverpool-based English football club that was founded in 1878. From 1884 to 1891, Everton FC played their games at Anfield. Everton FC moved to Goodison Park in 1892 after a dispute with John Houlding, the club president and property owner at Anfield. After Everton moved to Goodison Park, John Houlding was left with an empty stadium and no team, so he founded a new team to play at Anfield, naming them Liverpool F.C. and Athletic Grounds Ltd.

Under Tom Watson's guidance, the team won the League for the first time in 1901 and has since won 18 additional titles. Liverpool won the European Cup for the first time in 1977, and they have since won five more times.

After winning the League title in 1989/90, the team went thirty years without winning another league title, and the club also endured human loss in the notorious Heysel Stadium catastrophe and the Hillsborough disaster. Thousands of fans from all over the world walked alongside the club to offer their support during this difficult period. Liverpool Fc has walked on before I was born, is walking on today, and will continue to walk on after I am gone, but one thing is constant: my club will never walk alone.




