

Amrita Team Bags First Prize in All India Level Hackathon

"Infinity Gems", a student team from the Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering(ECE), Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore campus, emerged as winners in all India level Smart India Hackathon (SIH) 2020.

Team Infinity Gems developed a hardware and a software prototype, for the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, under the domain of Smart Communication that measures the quantity and quality of the gasoline being delivered to a customer at the petrol station. The gasoline is graded based on its quality and then sent to the customer's phone by scanning the QR code through the App developed. The team won INR 1,00,000 for developing this prototype.

Led by Balachander S, other members included Kalyan G Abenanth, U Sivakarthikeyan and R Dhanya of the 2017-2021 batch B. Tech. ECE and Kuttralam V C and Mohana Priya A S of 2017-2021 batch B. Tech CSE, mentored by Assistant Professor Sabarish Narayanan B, Dept of ECE, School of Engineering, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore campus and Sharon Sebastian, Makerspace Manager at CISCO thingQbator.

In January 2020, a form had been circulated to forward a detailed abstract of the problem statement chosen by the team of students. After first level of filtering, the team "Infinity Gems" qualified to go to the next round of the competition. CISCO thinQbator set up at Amrita Coimbatore campus provided a massive help by aiding the team with components for the Internal Hackathon. After the Internal Hackathon, the respective industry that gave the problem statement selected top 4-5 ideas to be presented at the Grande Finale Contest. During this process, for 2 different problem statements, 2 teams from Amrita School of Engineering, Coimbatore secured entry to Grand Finale of the Hackathon.

Since the Grande Finale had been postponed to August 1st to 3rd, 2020, due to imposition of restrictions of Covid-19 pandemic, CISCO thinQbator stepped in once again, by delivering the components directly to the team leader Balachander S, (not under Red zone). A virtual Grande Finale Hackathon was held from August 1st to August 3rd. With the support from faculties of Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham and CISCO thinQbator, the team was able to secure the 1st prize at the Smart India Hackathon.

Placement Readiness Assessment Centre (PRAC)

Placement Readiness Assessment Centre (PRAC) is part of the continuous learning and digitization drive from CIR L&D PG (MBA) Team. A senior team of CIR that consisted Mr. Jitesh M (Center Head, CIR, Bengaluru), Mr. Sreekumar U. Warrier (Centre Manager & Faculty Soft Skills, Kochi) and Mr. Ajith Kumar Nair (Senior Manager, Amritapuri) under the mentorship of Dr. Madhu Menon (Head - Learning & Development) identified and calibrated 10 key competencies that is expected by industry from fresh MBA graduates. This programme is conducted every year for the MBA students of all campuses of Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham. In this assessment centre, different assessment activities are conducted to measure the 10 key industry relevant competencies of students which were identified through the analysis of the MBA job profiles. At the end of the program, the students are categorized based on their levels of proficiency in each of the identified competencies. This enables to provide customized training inputs to the students based on their career aspirations and industry preferences.

During PRAC, different measurement activities were

tools and techniques, so that the results can be analyzed and compared across campuses. The assessment was conducted on November 22nd, 2019 (Bangalore students), December 3rd, 2019 (Coimbatore students), and December 14th, 2019 (Kochi and Amritapuri students). Students from 2020 passout batch across all the campuses of Amrita participated in the programme.

After the completion of the process and analysis of the results, each student was provided an individual profile with their scores along with a comparison of the same with campus average and university average (average of all campuses put together) for each competency. The students were provided customized feedback and training on a need basis using this profile.

Indian Navy signs MoU with Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham

Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Indian Navy for collaboration in aerospace, anti-submarine warfare, cybersecurity, management, and medical research. This agreement paves the way for combined research and development in all possible areas of mutual interest and strength, including M.Tech. and Ph.D. programs for Naval officers.

"This is the first time the Indian Navy has signed an MoU with a private university," said C. Parameswaran, Director, Corporate and Industry Relations of the university. Vice-Admiral Anil Kumar Chawla, Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief Southern Naval Command, who presided over the MoU signing ceremony on behalf of the Navy, observed that the MoU will help speed up the process of indigenization, in tune with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Make in India' program.

"It is a win-win situation for the Navy, the MSMEs (Micro, Small, Medium Enterprises) and the university, as a large number of employment opportunities will be created," said the Vice-Admiral citing the example of Germany which has successfully implemented this 'triangle model' for more than a century. "The Navy is already manufacturing ships, radars, sonars and the MoU will help institutionalize the cooperation between the Navy and Amrita Vishwa

Vidyapeetham in a more tangible manner," he added. Two student teams that won prestigious competitions were also felicitated at the event. Mr. C. Parameswaran announced that the team comprising of Saksthisree V., Yeshwant Sripaty, Vijay S. and Anupam had competed with 75,000 others from all over the world to win the TCS prize. Another team, comprising Anudeep J, and Kowshik from Department ECE, was also honored for winning the coveted Rakuten Hackathon, by competing with 2,500 other contestants from around the world.

Digital Learning Initiative for Vocabulary Building

Vocabulary is one of the very important areas of verbal and communication skills. The biggest challenge faced by our students while learning vocabulary is the difficulty in remembering the new words learnt and using them effectively in their communication. It is not possible to build a rich vocabulary overnight and it takes time and practice. As the saying goes, "little drops of water, little grains of sand, make the mighty ocean and the pleasant land". So, to facilitate continuous learning of vocabulary, an initiative called "Let's learn A Word a Day" WhatsApp group was formed by Ms. Anjali B.K. (Assistant Manager-Verbal & Communication skills) of the CIR L&D (PG team). Through the group one word was shared with the students every day along with a pictorial representation of the word, its pronunciation, meaning, part of speech and usage. The UG Soft Skills team comprising Mr. M. Unni Krishnan, Dr. R. Sunitha Kumari, Mr. R. Krishnan, Mr. Shiva Ramakrishnan and Mr. C. A. Ajiraj prepared and shared all content including PDF documents, PowerPoint presentations, audio and video files, for the final year students through the UG Soft Skills Guide website. Some

of the topics covered were resume preparation, grooming readiness, interview skills, importance of presence of mind, self-confidence, self-assessment, observation skills & listening skills, time management skills and managing stress & time pressure. 



Institution Innovation Council (IIC) Activities

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) at Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham was established in 2018-19 under MHRD Innovation Cell (MIC). It has been functioning under Dr. S. Balamurugan, Chairperson – EEE as its President, with Mr. R. Krishnan, ACE, CIR, as its Convener, both of whom along with Dr. Udaya Bhaskar Reddy and Mr. Sabarish Narayanan also perform the role of Innovation Ambassadors. The IIC draws support from a Faculty Team drawn from various Departments and an IIC Students' Forum representing the students.

So far, the IIC at Amrita has conducted 17 Calendar Activities, 32 MIC driven Activities, and 13 Self-driven Activities.

Seventeen online sessions were conducted by Amrita's IIC in collaboration with MIC, New Delhi to promote Innovation, IPR, Entrepreneurship, and Start-ups among HEIs from 28th April to 22nd May 2020 during COVID-19 nationwide lockdown. Apart from that, Amrita's IIC coordinated 9 sessions under the First Leadership Talk Series from 2nd May to 27th June, 2020.

A National Innovation Contest was also launched and is in an advanced stage. In the first phase, it received 22 approved innovative ideas, out of which 19 ideas were shortlisted by a panel constituted by Amrita's IIC for Proof of Concept (PoC) stage. Out of those, 13 PoCs qualified to Prototype development stage, when direct entries with an extended deadline were allowed. Finally, 5 best Prototypes have been identified for the National Innovation Contest from Amrita.
