"It's heart wrenching to see the latest news on the sexual assault and death of two minor girls from Walayar. I was doing my field work in DCPU, Palakkad and months back before this incident took place, we had this discussion with the IPO regarding the implementation of Raksha project in Walayar due to rise in suicide rate and sexual assault among minors in Walayar. We were asked to prepare questionnaires for the pilot study of this project in order to identify victims of sexual assault.Indeed the gravity of this issue in the place cannot be ignored and that particular project should be implemented soon in Walayar"

"At times it's confusing to look into whether movie depicts the societal problems or whether it promotes problems faced by the society"

"We are so engrossed in social media and gets carried away by the pieces of information circulating in social media which cannot be relied upon fully, so be smart enough to differentiate the real news from fake news and try as far as possible to stay away from such junk information"

AWARENESS: IMPORTANT BILLS, POLICIES AND **CURRENT AFFAIRS IMPORTANT BILLS OF 2019**

1. The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Bill, 2019

The Bill provides for reorganisation of the state of Jammu and Kashmir into the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh.

2. The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Code provides a time-bound process for resolving insolvency in companies and among individuals.

3. The National Medical Commission Bill, 2019

The Bill seeks to repeal the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and provide for a medical education system which ensures: (i) availability of adequate and high quality medical professionals, (ii) adoption of the latest medical research by medical professionals, (iii) periodic assessment of medical institutions, and (iv) an effective grievance redressal mechanism.

4. The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Bill amends the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012. The Act seeks death penalty for offences against children and establishment of more Special Courts in districts.

5. The Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Bill seeks to amend the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 to provide for road safety. The Act provides for grant of licenses and permits related to motor vehicles, standards for motor vehicles, and penalties for violation of these provisions.

6. The Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Bill seeks to amend the Central Universities Act, 2009, which establishes universities for teaching and research in various states.

. The Protection of Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Act provides for a National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), State Human Rights Commissions (SHRC), as well as Human Rights Courts.

8. The Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Amendment Bill, 2019

The Act provides special procedures to deal with terrorist activities, among other things.

9. The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Cadre) Bill, 2019

The Bill provides for reservation of teaching positions in central educational institutions for persons belonging to: (i) Scheduled Castes, (ii) Scheduled Tribes, (iii) socially and educationally backward classes, and (iv) economically weaker sections.

10. The Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Act sets up the Medical Council of India (MCI) which regulates medical education and practice. Provisions of this Bill will be effective from September 26, 2018.

11. The Special Economic Zones (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Act provides for the establishment, develoSCHES and management of Special Economic Zones for the promotion of exports.

12. The Jammu and Kashmir Reservation (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Act provides for reservation in appointment and promotions in state government posts, and admission to professional institutions for certain reserved categories. Professional institutions include government medical colleges, dental colleges, and polytechnics.

13. The Homoeopathy Central Council (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Act sets up the Central Council of Homoeopathy which regulates homoeopathic education and practice.
