Summer Training 2022

After the immense success and impact of the 2021 online summer training conducted across all campuses of Amrita, CIR, L&D decided to have 2022 summer training also in the online mode. This time Chennai campus also became part of the summer training as their first batch of B.Tech. students were coming into the final year placement process. The online summer training 2022 was planned for 2 weeks starting from 13th June 2022 to 25th June 2022.

The Participants

Out of the 1956 eligible students across all the four engineering campuses, 1922 students (98.26%) showed their willingness and readiness to attend the pre-placement training. A few students expressed their inability to attend the training as they were undergoing internships during the period and a few

of them stated that they are opting out of the placement processes as they are planning for higher studies.

Frame Work of the Summer Training

The training was planned for two weeks. The primary focus of the first week's training was on the basic programming and coding skills. A few sessions on the life skills areas like numerical aptitude and reasoning, interview preparation skills, motivational sessions, and verbal ability were conducted. These sessions were handled by the faculty members of Soft Skills, Aptitude, Verbal and Technical teams of CIR.



During the second week, the focus was more on the core skills specific to the specialisation of the students. These sessions were taken by faculty members from the corresponding departments, CIR technical team and Industry Experts. While planning the content, care was taken to make sure that the content covered is uniform though different trainers who conducted the sessions. The difficulty levels of the programming and coding sessions were appropriate to the branches/ specialisations of the students. For the preparation of the syllabi and topics for training, the resource persons were provided with question banks from previous years' questions asked by the recruiters. This was done to ensure that the training was focused on the placement preparation of the students.



The timetable was planned in such a way that there were 4 slots in a day starting at 9.30 AM and each were of one hour fifteen minutes duration i.e., two sessions in the morning and two sessions in the afternoon. There were special sessions arranged on most of the days on "career opportunities after under graduation". The sessions were planned in such a way that on most of the days the students would have one session free. All the relevant information was provided through exclusive Whatsapp groups created for the purpose of summer training. The on-line classes were handled through MS Teams channels which were created by our University's ICTS team at our request. All the technical sessions were recorded and were downloaded by the respective group owners for future company specific trainings. Close to 70% was the overall attendance recorded during the summer training. Review meetings were conducted on alternate days to understand the challenges from the CIR team members and to motivate the team to give their best in making the summer training impactful. From the training feedback it was evident that around 78% of the students were either very satisfied or satisfied with the coding and programming training they had received.

Here's a report prepared by ACE member, Varadharajan K., from 3rd year, CSE, on the face-to-face interactive session, titled - 'The startup of you', held in the Gokula Krishna Hall at the Corporate and Industry Relations (CIR) block, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore.

The solemn occasion started off around 5:45 PM with a small prayer invoking the grace of the Almighty. The chief guest was duly greeted with a welcome note by Mr. R. Approval of Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore, as Host Institute under MSME Innovative Scheme

Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, has been recognised as Host Institute (HI) for implementation of the Incubation component under MSME Innovative Scheme. The Office of the Development Commissioner, Ministry of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME) accorded in-principle approval in the meeting of 2nd Project Monitoring and Advisory Committee (PMAC) held on 22nd June, 2022, at New Delhi.

The application for registering Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Coimbatore as an HI to act as a Business Incubator (BI) was submitted through the MIS portal of the MoMSME website on 23.3.2022. Amrita Centre for Entrepreneurship (ACE), along with Corporate and Industry Relations (CIR), initiated this activity as part of its constant endeavour to promote innovation and entrepreneurship.

Amrita have some privileges and responsibilities as an approved HI for Business Incubation. Most important of them is attracting good business ideas from potential incubatees and forwarding selected ones to Ministry of MSME for financial assistance, after meticulous scrutiny. If these ideas get approved under the Incubation Scheme, they will get a funding support of up to Rs. 15 lakhs each. Financial assistance of up to Rs. 1 crore shall be provided to the HI for procurement and installation of relevant plant and machines including hardware and software etc. in the BI for R&D activities and common facilities for incubatees. This assistance will be applicable to Amrita after a minimum of two or more than two ideas have been approved under the Incubation Scheme.

Workshop on Goal Setting

"Your goals are the road maps that guide you and show you what is possible for your life" - Les Brown. As part of the training sessions in Soft Skills, a workshop on Goal Setting was conducted by Ms. Smitha G., Faculty for Soft Skills, for the students at the School of Medicine, School of Dentistry, and Centre for Allied Health Sciences. Students were trained on the relevance of goal setting for personal and professional development using the principles of Organizational Psychology. Students were given dummy targets and allocated into teams, to work upon goals to be achieved within a given time period. They were trained in preparing an action plan to be followed year-wise, month-wise and day-wise. Also, this was plotted on a chart and presented by respective groups. According to the feedback from students, they developed confidence and arrived at strategies and action plan to achieve their goals rather than keeping those as dreams. Reframing their personal goals into SMART goals was also an outcome of this workshop.

A CGS session was arranged for the undergraduate and postgraduate students of ASNSMM on 13 May 2022 to create awareness on various higher studies / career / research opportunities available in Japan.



Another CGS session was arranged for the undergraduate and postgraduate students on 16 May 2022 to deliver a research talk and to create awareness on various higher studies / career / research opportunities available in Canada. One more CGS session was arranged for the students of ASNSMM on 15 June 2022 in which students interacted with the delegates from Northern Illinois University (NIU), USA.

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Placements (ASNSMM)

Currently 8 students from the 2020-2022 PG batch are placed in their core area. Every year, chosen best students are offered research positions leading to Ph.D. by the Center. In the current year, 5 students were chosen for Ph.D. programs in various core areas.

Meanwhile, CIR arranged summer internships for all the students of MBA 2021-23 batch, of which a few received stipends as well. CIR team simultaneously conducted Aptitude training and one-on-one interaction to prepare them for placement.

School of Pharmacy

Placement process for the 2022 passing out students of B. Pharm, M. Pharm and Pharm D is currently in progress. So far, 12 students from B.Pharm, 21 students from M.Pharm and 4 students from Pharm.D are placed. The key recruiters so far are IQVIA, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, GlaxoSmithKline, Indegene, Immunocare Discovery Solutions, Straive, ICON PLC, Covance and Amrita Hospital. The companies in pipeline for the 2022 passing out students are BioQuest, IQVIA (PG), GlaxoSmithKline (UG), ICICI Prudential, Cipla, Syngene International, Biocon Biologicals, Aster Life Pharmacy, Apollo Hospital, Dr Catalyst.

Common Eligibility Test (CET)

CIR has been conducting the Common Eligibility Test for MCA, M.Sc. Chemistry and M. Com since the formation of the CIR team. The test would help the team to get a comprehensive view of the strength and weakness of students and thus assists the team to design a student-centric approach to pre-placement training.



Second Phase of Pre-Placement Training



As part of CIR Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Mysuru, the pre-placement training for Integrated MCA & MCA for the academic year 2021-2022 has been outsourced to Bizotic. Bizotic has started the second phase of pre-placement training for our students. The students are trained on Numerical Ability, Verbal Ability, Reasoning Ability and Company Specific modules. Mock tests are conducted periodically to prepare the students to face campus recruitment tests.

As the new CIR team is in place since the academic year 2022-2023, all the learning and development programs will be carried out by the team.
