From impactful clean-up efforts and healthcare initiatives to environmental sustainability projects, Amritavarsham 70 has marked a significant milestone, exemplifying a transformation in community welfare.

Marking the 70th birthday of our beloved Amma, Sri Mata Amritanandamayi Devi, unfolded with a week-long series of impactful service activities known as Sevanavaram. The Amrita Viswa Vidyapeetham Coimbatore campus took center stage from the 25th to the 29th of September, engaging in a variety of initiatives that showcased the spirit of selfless service.

Sevanavaram commenced on September 25th as 200 volunteers actively engaged in a joint cleanup initiative. Poonga Gounden Pudur, Ettimadai Junction, and Chavadi came alive as the community worked together towards achieving cleanliness.

In tandem, the campus embraced the green agenda with the planting of 40 saplings in a temple premises in Ettimdai to reflect a profound commitment to environmental sustainability.

Amrita Vidyalayam curated harmonious celebration, intertwining the threads of compassion, medical care, and a dedicated commitment to environmental stewardship. A total of 300 individuals benefited from the collaborative efforts with the Shankara Eye Foundation, with an impactful eye camp providing vision care, while the second medical camp cast a wide net, addressing vital health concerns such as pregnancy, anemia, and malnutrition. The spirit of nurturing extended to the soil as well, with a tree planting initiative at SR Venkateshwara College Road as seventy flowering plants were planted by 50 volunteers.

YAs part of an educational initiative, a dedicated team of approximately 50 volunteers ventured into five tribal schools, spreading the light of knowledge through the distribution of educational materials.

A collaborative effort engaging freshers across all departments led to the creation of 23,000 seedballs, serving as a tangible testament to the campus's unwavering dedication to sustainability and commitment. Taking this commitment further, 100 volunteers carried 10,000 seedballs to Arulmigu Dharamalingeswarar Temple, the Hill Top temple of Lord Siva in Madukkarai, dispersing the seeds in nearby barren areas, symbolizing the promise of revitalization.

Fifty volunteers from the NSS Unit extended compassion to six different Hospital Wards in Coimbatore Government Hospital. Distributing 500 kits containing essentials like bedsheets, steel tumblers, and towels, they aimed not just to address physical needs but to bring solace and care. The esteemed Dean of the Medical College graced the occasion as the chief guest.

The campus became a hub of camaraderie as 100 students from various schools stepped onto its grounds. In an enriching exchange, educational kits were distributed, symbolizing a commitment to fostering knowledge beyond borders.

Volunteers reached out to three Child Homes in Podanur and R S Puram. Sweets, notebooks, and pens found their way into the hands of 75 young residents, while fruit kits and cultural activities added joy to their lives. Educational kits and lunch brought smiles to the faces of girls in another Child Home, an experience shared by 40 volunteers.


