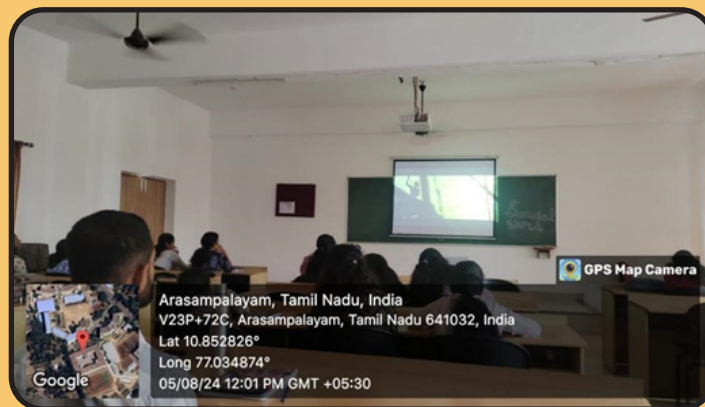

The Department of Social Work at Coimbatore joins hands with the Karkai Nandre initiative by the government in partnership with the ANT foundation and charitable trust of Coimbatore. The name of the initiative comes from a Tamil poem Karkai nandre karkai nandre pichai pukinum karkai nandre meaning "even if one is begging, it is better to get educated". This serves as the base of this program which is focused on counseling and providing guidance to school children in order to stop discontinuing or hindering their education at any cost. Several middle schools, high schools and higher secondary schools in Coimbatore are focused and children are given counseling and assistance by the volunteers through this program. A total of five schools are allotted to Amrita where the program is to be initiated through a resource person, student in charge and other student volunteers of the department. Karkai Nandre is a government initiative in collaboration with the ANT (Achieve and Thrive) foundation and charitable trust, Coimbatore. The project is implemented in three phases where the first one is a general counseling followed by 4 to 8 hours of individual or group counseling at schools and then the documentation and other procedures. The project was introduced to the students of second MSW and PhD scholars along with the faculties Dr. V. Priya and Dr. Prasath Selvaraj at Corporation Girls Higher Secondary School, R S Puram, Coimbatore on August 17, 2024 and a general introduction all the students and faculties of School of Social and Behavioural Sciences was given on August 23, 2024 when Mrs. Lata Sundaram from ANT visited Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Arasampallyam.

FOLK ARTS WORKSHOP ORGANIZED FOR THE FIRST YEAR STUDENTS OF SSBS

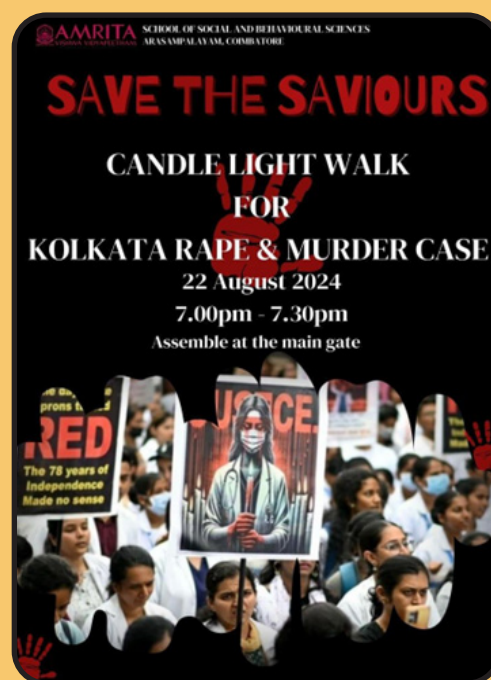

GOKULASHTAMI CELEBRATIONS 2024

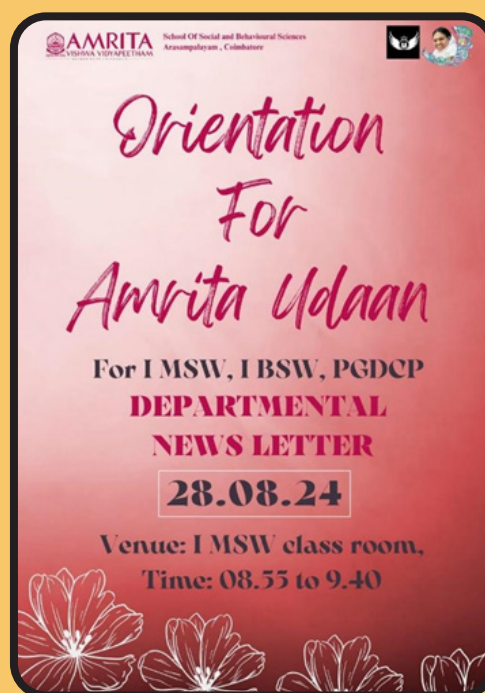

FAMOUS SOCIAL WORKER

IDA B. WELLS (1862-1931)

Ida B. Wells, a pioneering social worker and journalist, is celebrated for her tireless advocacy for racial and gender equality. Born into slavery on July 16, 1862, in Holly Springs, Mississippi, Wells emerged from a life of hardship to become a formidable force for social justice. Her parents, political activists themselves, imbued her with a strong sense of purpose and activism. After the tragic death of her parents from yellow fever when she was just 16, Wells assumed the responsibility of supporting her younger siblings, becoming a teacher to provide for them. Despite facing numerous obstacles, including expulsion from college for her outspoken views, Wells's resolve only strengthened. She moved to Memphis, Tennessee, to attend Fisk University and soon began collaborating with prominent reformers such as W.E.B. Du Bois, Frederick Douglass, and Mary Church Terrell. Her early career as a journalist saw her documenting and condemning the brutal practice of lynching, which was often portrayed as a form of racial retribution rather than justice. Her groundbreaking pamphlets, "Southern Horrors: Lynch Law in All Its Phases" and "The Red Record: Tabulated Statistics and Alleged Causes of Lynching in the United States," were instrumental in shifting the narrative and exposing the systemic racism underpinning these acts of violence. Wells's work extended beyond journalism into the realm of social activism and reform. She co-founded the Alpha Suffrage League, advocating for African-American women's right to vote and challenging the exclusionary practices of the National American Woman Suffrage Association. Her commitment to equality also led to her involvement in the founding of the NAACP and The Negro Fellowship League. Through these organizations, she contributed to the development of modern social work and played a crucial role in supporting African Americans migrating from the South to the North. Towards the end of her life, Wells focused on urban reform in Chicago, continuing her advocacy until her death from kidney disease in 1931. Her legacy has been preserved and celebrated through numerous awards, including those established by the National Association of Black Journalists, the Medill School of Journalism, and other institutions. The Ida B. Wells Memorial Foundation and the Ida B. Wells Museum, along with the Ida B. Wells-Barnett Museum in her hometown of Holly Springs, serve as testaments to her enduring impact on social justice and African American history. Her life and work continue to inspire new generations of activists and social workers committed to the pursuit of equality and justice.

BLOOD DIAMOND

Blood Diamond (2006), directed by Edward Zwick, is a gripping drama that delves into the harrowing world of conflict diamonds in war-torn Sierra Leone during the late 1990s. SCHEMES AND ACTS



ACTS

THE BORDER SECURITY FORCE ACT, 1968

The Border Security Force Act of 1968 is a crucial piece of legislation that defines the roles, responsibilities, and functioning of the Border Security Force (BSF) in India. As a part of India's Central Armed Police Forces, the BSF is primarily responsible for guarding the country's land borders during peacetime and preventing transnational crimes. The Act specifies the establishment of the BSF, detailing its structure and the manner of appointment for its officers and personnel. This provides a clear organizational framework to ensure that the force operates effectively.



The Act outlines the duties and responsibilities of the BSF, which include safeguarding India's borders, preventing unauthorized entry or exit across the national boundary, and detecting and preventing smuggling and other illegal activities. The BSF plays a vital role in maintaining border security and ensuring that such activities are kept in check. To empower the BSF to perform its duties effectively, the Act grants it certain powers similar to those of the armed forces. These powers include the authority to arrest individuals, conduct searches, and seize items without a warrant in specific situations. The Act also allows the use of force when necessary, thereby equipping the BSF to handle challenging situations that may arise at the border.

Maintaining discipline within the BSF is crucial, and the Act provides a comprehensive code of conduct and disciplinary framework. This framework includes provisions for offenses, penalties, and disciplinary proceedings, ensuring that BSF personnel adhere to high standards of behavior and discipline. The Act establishes BSF Courts to handle legal matters related to the force, providing a structured legal process to address issues and disputes within the BSF. This legal framework is essential for the effective functioning of the BSF, enabling it to fulfill its mandate of securing India's borders.

CENTRAL GOVERNMENT SCHEME

SAVITRIBAI JYOTIRAO PHULE FELLOWSHIP FOR SINGLE GIRL CHILD(SJSGC)

- The Savitribai Jyotirao Phule Fellowship for Single Girl Child (SJSGC) is a fellowship scheme initiated by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under the Department of Higher Education. It is designed to support research leading to a Ph.D. degree specifically for single girl children, meaning those who are the only girl child in their family without any brothers or sisters. The scheme also extends eligibility to a girl scholar who is one of twin or fraternal daughters. The number of fellowships awarded each year will be determined based on the number of eligible applications received through an online process.
- The primary objectives of the SJSGC scheme are to support the higher education of single girl children, particularly in the field of Social Sciences, and to promote the observance of the small family norm. It also aims to recognize and propagate the concept of single girl child norm within society, thus encouraging and promoting the education of single girls.
- To be eligible for this fellowship, a candidate must be a single girl child pursuing a Ph.D. in any discipline at a recognized university, college, or institute. The scheme is only applicable to those who are enrolled in a regular, full-time Ph.D. program; part-time or distance education modes are not covered. Furthermore, girl students up to the age of 40 years for the general category, and up to 45 years for reserved categories such as SC/ST/OBC and Persons with Disabilities (PWD), are eligible as of the last date of application submission. Both the scholar and the institution where the Ph.D. is being pursued are responsible for ensuring that the fellowship's terms and conditions are strictly followed and that only eligible candidates receive the fellowship.

STATE GOVERNMENT SCHEME

CHIEF MINISTER'S COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH INSURANCE SCHEME

Chief Minister's comprehensive wellbeing protections scheme The Chief Serve Comprehensive Wellbeing Protections Conspire (CMCHIS), propelled on July 23, 2009, points to give quality healthcare to qualified families through both government and private healing centers. Overseen by Joined together India Protections Company from January 2022 to 2027, the plot covers around 1.37 crore families. It incorporates 1090 strategies, 8 follow-up strategies, and 52 demonstrative tests over 800 government and 900 private healing centers. CMCHIS offers cashless hospitalization with scope up to Rs. 5,00,000 per family per year, making a difference to diminish money-related strain while moving forward to healthcare. Benefits The Chief Serve Comprehensive Wellbeing Protections Plot offers vital budgetary back for restorative crises, making a difference



families oversee tall healthcare costs without money related strain. It brags a wide organization of clinics, guaranteeing speedy get to treatment indeed in farther zones. The conspiracy covers a wide extent of medicines and gives up to Rs. 5 lakh per family every year, facilitating the burden of healthcare costs. Moreover, it incorporates scope for follow-up medications and demonstrative strategies, advance lessening out-of-pocket costs for beneficiaries.

Eligibility The Chief Minister's Comprehensive Wellbeing Protections Plot is for Tamil Nadu inhabitants who meet particular criteria: their title must be on the family card, and their family's yearly wage must be underneath Rs. 1,20,000. Qualification is confirmed with reports like the family card, Aadhar card, salary certificate, and a self-declaration from the family head. The plot covers the qualified person, their life partner, children, and subordinate guardians, giving them access to quality healthcare administrations without monetary strain. **Exclusion** Health Protections Conspire prohibits non-residents of Tamil Nadu, people with an salary over Rs. 72,000, those not recorded on the family apportion card, non-Sri Lankan Qualification for the Chief Minister's Comprehensive displaced people without citizenship confirmation, transients missing substantial certificates, and vagrants or protected young ladies not partnered with any organization.

1. PM Modi to address Third Voice of Global South Summit

Under the subject "An Enabled Worldwide South for a Feasible Future," Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of worldwide inclusivity is encapsulated in the third Voice of Worldwide South Summit (VOGSS), which is being facilitated online by India. Global South countries have a gathering to talk about imperative issues such as wars, the vitality and nourishment emergencies, and climate change at this summit. A Leaders' Session and ecclesiastical talks on exchange, youth, wellbeing, vitality, advanced foundation, back, instruction, and climate altar are among the themes secured. VOGSS has worked with more than 120 countries since its establishment in 2023, affecting worldwide dialogues and the G-20 plan while exhibiting India's devotion to creating nations and reinforcing their position in worldwide governance.

2. Germany Joins 18th Part State of Joined together Countries Command in South Korea

As the 18th part of the Joined together Countries Command (UNC), beneath the course of the United States, Germany has joined the association in South Korea, exhibiting its commitment to worldwide security and the interdependency of soundness in Europe and the Indo-Pacific. The UNC, which was built up in 1950 to keep up the peace negotiation amid the Korean War, is driven by the US and is overseen independently from the UN. By advertising important viewpoints and assets, Germany's engagement supports the UNC's capabilities and fits with broader objectives to improve territorial security against dictator dangers. Germany's collaboration has been invited by South Korea, in spite of concerns communicated by China and North Korea, who see Germany's nearness as an expansion of Western dominance in Asia.

3. India, Sri Lanka Deploy K9s in Exercise Mitra Shakti

From August 12 to August 25, 2024, the Army Training School at Maduru Oya, Sri Lanka, will host the 10th Exercise Mitra Shakti, a combined military exercise between India and Sri Lanka. Military canines play a significant part this year. One such dog is Zac, an Indian Army Belgian Malinois. With his training in sophisticated abilities like explosive detection and

weapon retrieval, Zac emphasizes the increasing significance of K9s in military endeavors. The goal of the exercise is to improve the two countries' combined counter-insurgency capabilities by simulating terrorist attacks and utilizing advanced surveillance methods and unified command centers.

4. Non-Native Species Threaten Antarctic Marine Ecosystems

The growing threat of non-native species colonizing Antarctica is highlighted by recent studies, which is mostly attributable to increased maritime activities and climate change. There is a serious risk to the delicate Antarctic environment as more ships visit and depart from the area because species from warmer climates may board floating garbage. If these intruders establish themselves, native species which are especially suited to the extreme cold may experience serious problems, particularly as rising temperatures lead to an increase in the amount of ice-free areas. Debris floating in from far-off places like Australia, South Africa, South America, and New Zealand increases the possibility of non-native organisms making it to Antarctica.

5. India Surpasses China As Top Importer of Russian Oil

In July 2024, India surpassed China as the largest importer of Russian oil, driven by a decline in China's profitability from refining, leading them to reduce their purchases. Russian oil constituted 44% of India's total oil imports, with India importing 2.07 million barrels per day, marking a 4.2% increase from June and a 12% rise from July 2022. Meanwhile, China's imports fell to 1.76 million barrels per day. India's surge in imports is attributed to the availability of discounted Russian oil due to Western sanctions imposed after Russia's invasion of Ukraine. This shift has stabilized global oil prices and inflation, with India also increasing its imports of Russian ESPO Blend crude, which was traditionally destined for China. Additionally, India's oil imports from the Middle East rose by 4%, with Iraq, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE becoming key suppliers.

6. New Blood Test Detects Alzheimer's with 90% Accuracy

Researchers at Lund University in Sweden have introduced an innovative blood test named PrecivityAD2, which boasts approximately 90% accuracy in detecting Alzheimer's disease (AD). This advancement is particularly valuable for individuals exhibiting mild cognitive impairment, as it facilitates earlier and more accurate diagnosis. Published in

the peer-reviewed journal JAMA, the test addresses a significant challenge in Alzheimer's detection. Traditionally, diagnosing Alzheimer's has been complex and costly, relying on procedures like PET scans or lumbar punctures to assess amyloid and Tau proteins in the brain. The PrecivityAD2 test simplifies this process by requiring only a blood sample, which enhances accessibility and reduces diagnostic errors. Early detection is critical in Alzheimer's care, helping to prevent misdiagnosis that occurs in 25% to 35% of cases, even among specialists.

7. India-US Discuss Energy Cooperation in High-Level Meeting

Union Power Minister Manohar Lal and John Podesta, a senior adviser to the US President on International Climate Policy, held a significant meeting to enhance energy cooperation between India and the United States. The discussions focused on advancing clean energy projects and were deemed productive by both parties. Key areas of collaboration included modernizing India's electricity grid, boosting the country's manufacturing capacity for renewable energy technologies, and exploring partnerships in advanced energy storage systems to ensure a stable power supply from renewable sources.

8. Sweden Reports First Case of mpox Strain outside Africa

The WHO declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on August 15, 2024, in response to the WHO's announcement of the first case of the new clade I variation of mpox outside of Africa. Clade 1b was spreading quickly at the time. While clade I has not been discovered, mpox associated with clade II of the 2022 epidemic has been found in wastewater from California and Illinois in the United States. Compared to 1,145 cases and seven deaths the year before, almost 2,100 cases of mpox and thirteen deaths were reported in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and eleven other countries in 2024.

9. ISRO Launched SSLV-D3-EOS-08

ISRO's SSLV-D3-EOS-08 mission, the third flight of the Small Satellite Launch Vehicle series, was launched on August 16 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre. This mission follows the successful SSLV-D2-EOS-07 in February 2023. The 34-meter-tall SSLV rocket can carry payloads up to 500 kg into Low Earth Orbit (LEO). The mission's goals include deploying a microsatellite, developing new instruments, and advancing satellite technology. The Earth Observation Satellite, weighing 175.5 kg, operates on 420 watts, has a one-year mission life, and is built on the Microsat/IMS-1 bus.

10. Invasive Nature of Lantana

Recent research led by Professor Mathieu Morlighem offers a more optimistic view of the risk of ice collapse in Antarctica. While the ice sheets in West Antarctica remain vulnerable, the study indicates that the threat of catastrophic collapse may be lower than previously thought. Scientists used computer models to explore what could happen if the towering ice cliffs formed by melting ice sheets began to break apart. Contrary to earlier concerns, the models suggest that the ice might flow into the ocean faster, which would prevent the cliffs from becoming tall enough to collapse dramatically. This finding is particularly relevant to the Thwaites Glacier, a rapidly melting glacier in Antarctica. The study tested two scenarios: one where the glacier's floating ice shelf vanishes immediately and another where it disappears by 2065. In both cases, rather than triggering widespread collapse, the glacier simply accelerated its flow into the ocean. This research indicates that the potential for a severe breakdown of Antarctic ice may not be as high as once feared.

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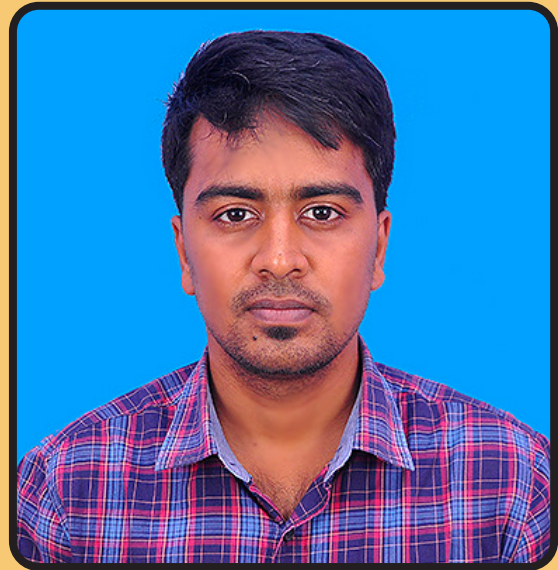
