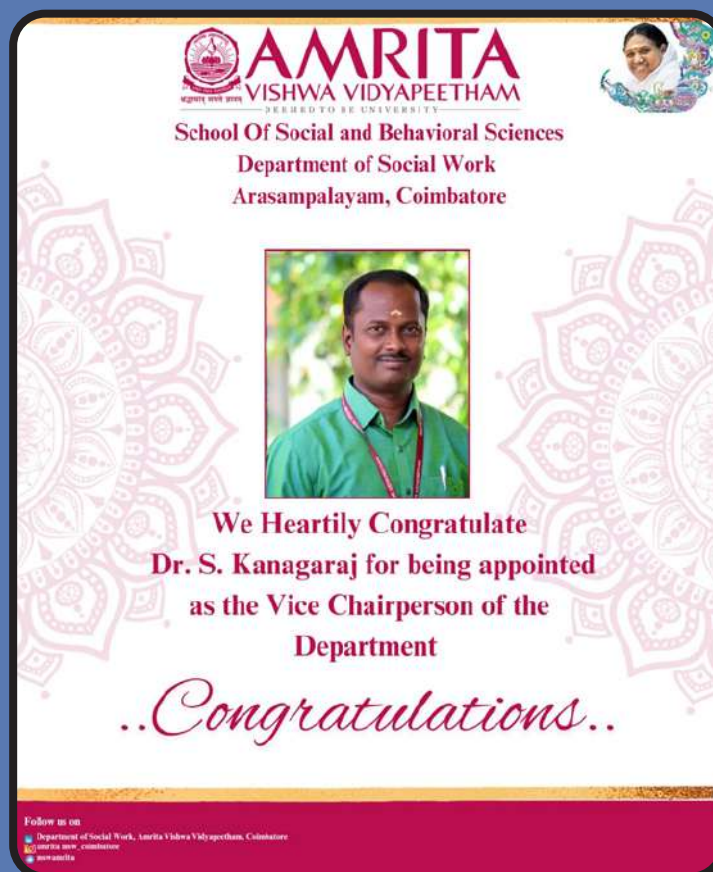

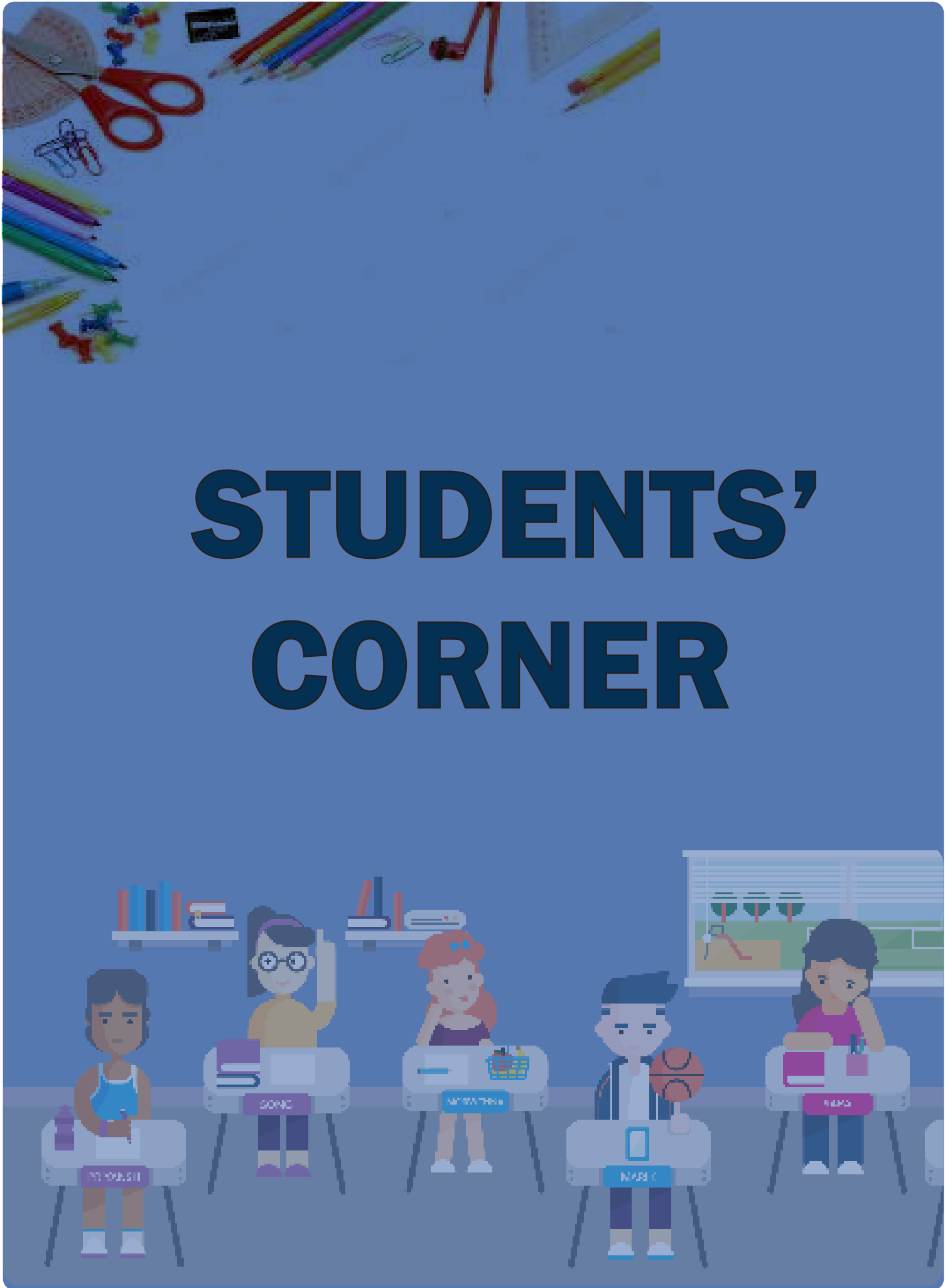
FRESHER'S DAY AT SSBS

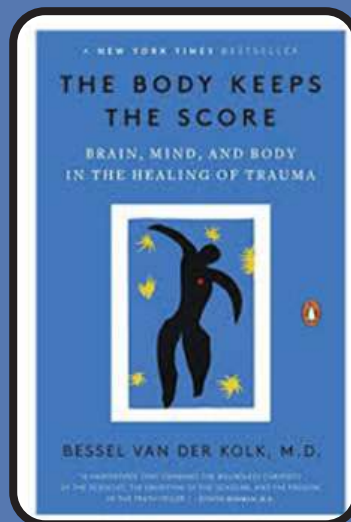
“THE BODY KEEPS THE SCORE

Dr. Bessel van der Kolk's *The Body Keeps the Score* is a compelling examination of how trauma impacts the body as a whole, not just the head. Drawing on his vast background as a psychiatrist and trauma researcher, Dr. van der Kolk challenges conventional wisdom by demonstrating how trauma leaves a physical mark that changes the structure of the brain and impacts the nervous system years after the initial incident. This book clarifies why talking about terrible experiences is frequently insufficient and why they don't simply go away.

The book's support of body-centered therapies, including yoga, EMDR, and neurofeedback, which assist trauma survivors in reestablishing a connection with their bodies and emotions in ways that traditional therapy might not be able to, is among its most perceptive contributions. Dr. van der Kolk demonstrates how these therapies aid in the unlocking and processing of trauma, which he characterizes as being "stored" in the body, using accessible case studies and personal tales. His observations emphasize the value of a holistic approach to healing that takes the body and mind into account.

The book also explores how relationships and the sense of security that enables us to connect and trust people are disrupted by trauma. In order to support trauma survivors in settings that frequently lack empathy and understanding, Dr. van der Kolk advocates for trauma-informed methods in the fields of education, healthcare, and justice.

The Body Keeps the Score is a must-read for trauma sufferers, mental health professionals, and anybody else wishing to comprehend the practical effects of trauma. It is written with a blend of scientific depth and compassion, and it is both easily readable and extremely educational. In the end, Dr. van der Kolk's work gives readers hope: given the correct resources and knowledge, rehabilitation is achievable.

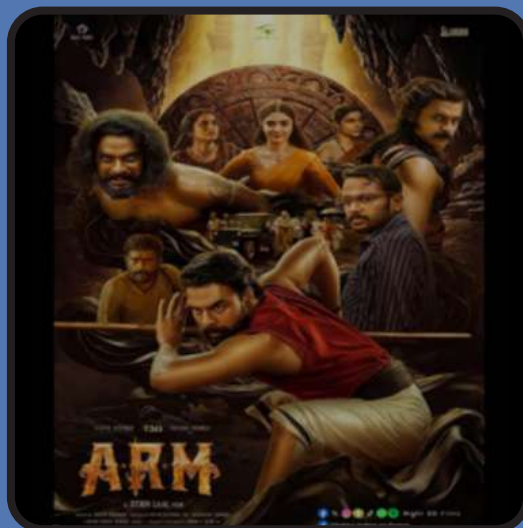
FILM REVIEW

“Ajayante Randam Moshanam” (ARM) is a captivating 2024 Indian Malayalam-language action-adventure film directed by Jithin Lal. The movie boasts impressive visuals, masterful storytelling and outstanding performances. Tovino Thomas shines in his triple role as Kunjikelu, Maniyan and Ajayan, showcasing versatility and depth. The narrative seamlessly blends magic, supernatural elements, folktales, history and romance, keeping viewers engaged. Non-linear storytelling effectively explores power, loyalty and redemption themes. This is an example of how a fairytale should be told. Great visuals, mesmerizing music and impeccable performances.

Tovi’s triple performance in ARM is a revelation. As Ajayan, Kelu, and particularly Maniyan, he conveys extraordinary characters. The film’s locks in story, staggering visuals, and uncommon exhibitions make it a must-watch. There are so many actors in this movie and they all have , even a little, but something to do that leaves an impact. Like the character played by Biju Kuttan or Jagadish or even Sudheesh. They all complete the story.

ACTS

MAINTENANCE AND WELFARE OF PARENTS AND SENIOR CITIZENS ACT, 2007

The Indian government enacted the "Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007" to protect the rights of senior citizens and parents in the country. Aiming at the vulnerabilities associated with old age and dependency thereof, this Act ensures care and support from children or their legal heirs for the elders. Given that the family is always under transformation in India because of migration with economic reasons and modification of social structure, it represents the respect, dignity, and welfare of elderly in this legislation.



Under this act, every adult child along with other legal heirs has statutory liability to maintain his/her parents and provide them at least with basic requirements: food, shelter, or healthcare. In case the liable parties are incapable of undertaking these roles, parents can seek maintenance through the tribunal, which is a body of court to address such cases. The sum of maintenance determined by the tribunal shall suffice the reasonable needs of senior citizens. The Act accords this to the senior citizens also in case they do not have any children but have relatives to take care of them.

One of the important provisions of the Act is that it establishes tribunals in each district to provide avenues for complaints by senior citizens of neglect or refusal of maintenance. The Act, in fact, provides a smooth, quick process for complaints and includes penalties for non-compliance. If the elderly people are abandoned or deprived of essential amenities, they can move to the tribunal. The tribunal can issue a directive to children or other family members to pay a maintenance allowance up to Rs 10,000 a month with interest on delay. The Act relates to the financial needs of the elderly people, as well as their health, safety, and all forms of emotional support.

States ensure that there are proper health care facilities and old-age homes for the aged. This Act safeguards the rights of the senior citizens and brings social welfare. This act compels the youth to be responsible towards their aged parents. In this respect, prioritizing the welfare of seniors is a very robust legislation which fosters a sensitive society which values its aged persons.

STATE SCHEME

PROMOTION OF ENERGY AUDIT AND CONSERVATION OF ENERGY SCHEME (PEACE)

Micro Small and Medium Enterprises

Department, Government of Tamil Nadu, offers the scheme Promoting Energy Audit and Conservation of Energy (PEACE). The "Training Programme" of this scheme envisions making MSMEs capable enough to design and develop systems and processes, which could enhance energy performance and subsequently energy efficiency in order to save energy as well as cost. It is expected that the training shall be organized by GM, DICs/RJD,



Chennai in cooperation with Associations of MSMEs, Product Associations, Clusters, and others. The participants will be exposed to the ways in which an efficient EnMS can help their organisation in improving energy efficiency, saving costs, and reducing emissions of GHG. A well-designed training program appropriate to the needs of MSMEs/ clusters has to be designed. Programmes could especially be framed around utilities and systems that a specific industry is dealing with in its day-to-day. For example, energy audit and conservation in electrical systems like maximum demand control, power factor control servo motors, transformers, pumps, fans, air-conditioning units, chillers, DG sets, lighting systems, air compressors, etc.

Programme Duration :

- The course would be for 3-4 days, based on the need and requirement
- Whichever feasible, training will be scheduled sector-wise/cluster-wise/product-wise

Fund Utilisation

- At least one training program in a district for an amount not exceeding 75,000/- on a single training program.
- Participants for the program would be Employees, Engineers and executives of MSMEs, who have volunteered to undergo the energy audit.
- The maximum no. in a batch for this training should be 20-25.

MSMEs in the immediate neighborhood districts can also be included during cluster/sector-specific events.

CENTRAL SCHEME

THE LOKPAL OF INDIA INTERNSHIP SCHEME

The Lokpal Internship Program in India provides a unique opportunity to the interns to gain in-depth knowledge of various laws related to corruption and public accountability such as the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, the Crime Prevention, Central Vigilance Commission Act and the Health Protection Act.

Benefits

India's Lokpal Internship Program provides comprehensive training to those interested in public administration and combating corruption. Over a period of six weeks, interns will learn about laws such as the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, Prevention of Crime, Central Vigilance Commission Act and Delhi Police Service Act, and will be exposed to the role of institutions such as Lokpal, Central Vigilance Bureau Commission and CBI. Interns are required to attend every working day and will receive a stipend of Rs.10,000 per month.

Eligibility

Applicants for the Lokpal Internship Program in India must be current undergraduate or postgraduate students in the fields of law, politics, public administration, public law, regulation, business or human rights. They must have at least 75% or equivalent in Class 12. Postgraduate applicants must have completed at least two years of study with an overall grade of at least 55% or equivalent in the year they completed prior to the application date. Postgraduate applicants must have at least 55% or equivalent in their degree. Applicants must also have their own laptop for use during work.

Application Process

The interested Candidate can apply through their Institute/College/University along with the application form given in the official site of Lokpal .

- Educational Certificate
- Recommendation Certificate
- Any Other Document If Required

1) How did martial arts from ancient India impact the performing arts?

Ancient martial techniques served as the foundation for many Indian performance arts. The wars of the Mahabharata are portrayed in Kathakali and Velakali, which were influenced by the Kerala martial art Kalaripayattu. While Silambam and Mudiyettu demonstrate battle techniques, Odisha's Chhau mask dance combines swordplay and acrobatics. South Indian street plays, which emphasize the martial origins of South Asian arts, also depict these battle themes.

2) What role do Paryushan and Das Lakshana play in Jainism?

The Paryushan, a major Jain holiday that is observed in August and September, emphasizes forgiveness and fosters peace and fraternity. The monks' stay in one location throughout the rainy season (Chaturmas) is commemorated. During this time, Jains abstain from violence, including eating green vegetables, and engage in penance. Shvetambara Jains (Pareshaan) celebrate for eight days, whereas Digambara Jains (Das Lakshana) celebrate for ten days.

3) India's position in the 2024 Global Nature Conservation Index (NCI) is 176th.

India received a score of 45.5 out of 100 on the Global Nature Conservation Index (NCI) 2024, placing it 176th. India, Kiribati, Turkey, Iraq, and Micronesia are now among the world's five worst performers. On October 24, 2024, the NCI was published, evaluating conservation initiatives in 180 nations.

4) At Sindhudurg Fort, the Indian Navy conducted an operational demonstration.

The Indian Navy will perform a magnificent "Operational Demonstration" at the famous Sindhudurg Fort on the country's western coast on December 4, 2023, to highlight its operational strength and capabilities. The event, which will be hosted by Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral R Hari Kumar, will feature a variety of naval activities involving both ships and planes.

5) Visit to Oman by Indian Coast Guard Ship Sajag for Three Days

During a three-day visit to Port Sultan Qaboos, Muscat, Oman, on November 29, 2023, the Indian Coast Guard Ship Sajag, an offshore patrol vessel, arrived as part of the Indian Coast Guard's West Asia deployment. The purpose of the tour is to support

interoperability with the Royal Oman Police Coast Guard (ROPCG) and other maritime authorities, improve maritime cooperation, and fortify the long-standing diplomatic ties between India and Oman. 6) Encouraging Women in Agriculture: Central Sector Drone Initiative.

Under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the Union Cabinet has approved a Central Sector Scheme to support Women Self Help Groups (SHGs) by supplying drones. With a budget of Rs. 1261 Crore for 2024-2025-2025-2026, this innovative program aims to empower women in agriculture by utilizing technology innovations.

7) Notice of Safety Concerning the Purchase of Acid via E-Commerce Platforms: Consumer Protection Alert.

Under the direction of Chief Commissioner Mrs. Nidhi Khare, the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has issued a Safety Notice in accordance with Section 18(2)(j) of the Consumer Protection Act of 2019. With a focus on the possible risks and hazards involved, the notice attempts to warn customers against buying extremely corrosive chemicals through online retailers.

8) Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN) approved by the cabinet.

An important effort for tribal welfare, the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN), has received approval from the Union Cabinet, which is led by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. With a central share of Rs. 15,336 crore and a state share of Rs. 8,768 crore, the program has a total budget of Rs. 24,104 crore.

9) Bacterial Memory Revealed: The Amazing Recall Capabilities of E. Coli.

In a novel study, researchers from the Universities of Texas and Delaware have discovered an unexpected memory system in the single-celled creature Escherichia coli (E. coli), which lacks a brain or nervous system. This additional capacity enables E. coli to retain memories of the past and pass them on to subsequent generations.
