Painting of Exterior Walls:

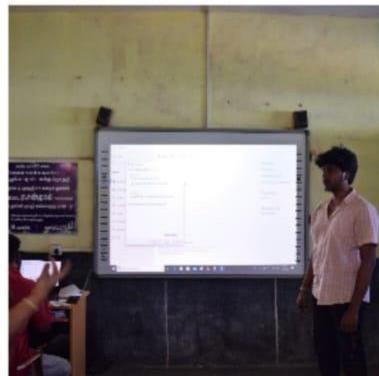
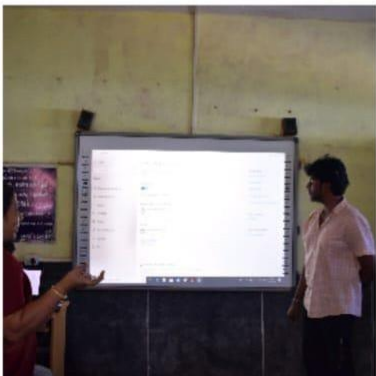
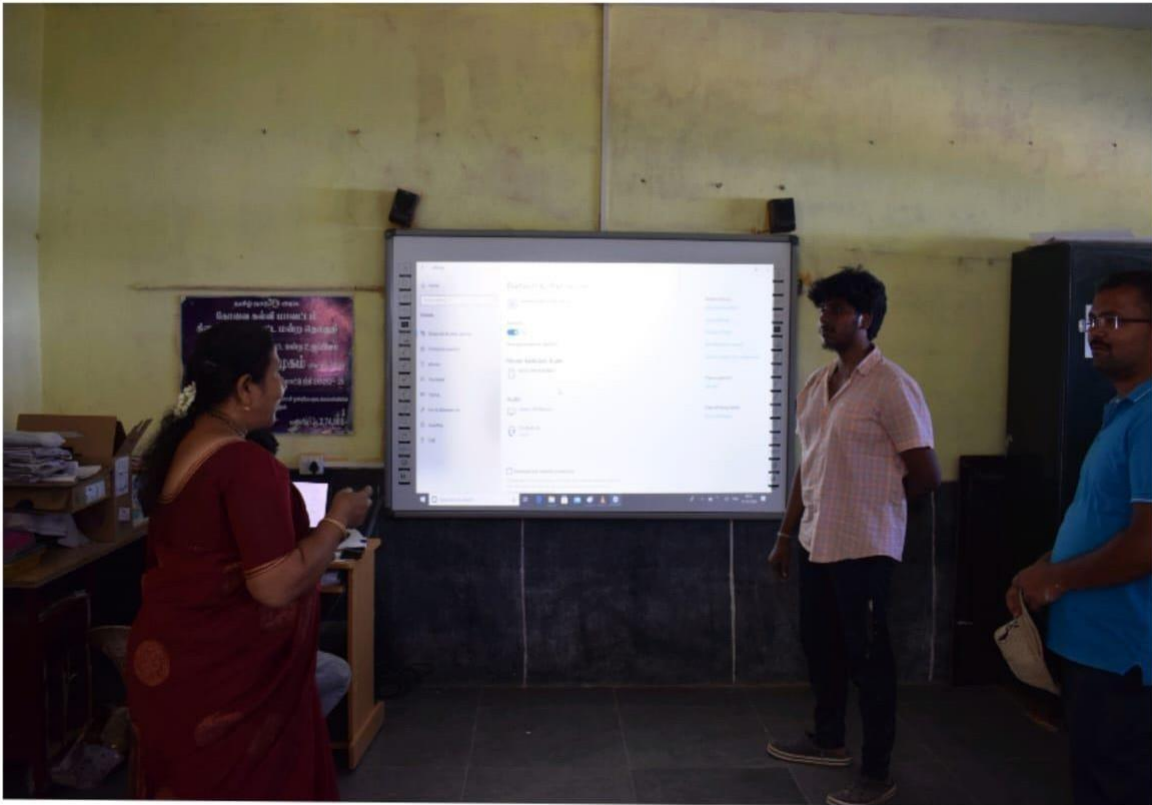
