


The Student Induction Cell, Office of Students' Welfare with Dr N Lalithamani, as the main coordinator, organized the program. Dr A S Ramkumar, Professor of Students' Welfare along with the faculty team of the Students' Welfare Department took charge of the overall program events. It supported all clerical and logistics factors as well.

The respective Chairpersons and Vice Chairpersons of the department, class advisors, UHV-trained faculty members, Amrita Darshanam, Physical Education Department, ICTS Team, Hostel Administration and Event Management team were closely involved in the smooth conduct of Deeksharambh. The Student Induction Program had a six-day session, which included an orientation session on Day 0. From Day 1 to Day 5, there were organised sessions on universal human values, yoga, nature walk, creative arts, motivational talk, MCUBE - Music, Meditation & Memory techniques, DISHA Bharat Workshops on learning management, language practices, hostel interactions, local city visit and respective department visit.









The Onam Festival falls during the Malayalam month of Chingam (August – September). It is the biggest festival of Kerala celebrated with joy and enthusiasm by people of all communities .

It commemorates the subsequent homecoming of the legendary Emperor Mahabali. Onam is reminiscent of Kerala's agrarian past and is considered to be a harvest festival.

This campus is a prestigious educational institution with a diverse student population. While the primary cultural influence in Tamil Nadu is different from Kerala, Onam is still celebrated with enthusiasm. It brings together students from various backgrounds. This is done by indulging in festivites together.

Students participated in a Pookalam (flower rangoli) competition first. Students from different departments and hostels created elaborate floral designs.

Flower Mandalas represented smaller parts of a greater whole. Nila Vilakku decorated the Pandal, giving it a sense of serenity. Maveli Mannan was given a grand welcome with Onappattukal, Chenda Melam, Thiruvathirakali, Thalapoli and Pulikali surrounding his arrival.

### Ganesh Chaturthi 2023

The auspicious Hindu festival of Ganesh Chaturthi is celebrated annually with pomp in India. Also known as Vinayaka Chaturthi or Ganesh Utsav, the day marks the birth of Lord Ganesha and is observed for ten days by devotees. It falls annually on the Chaturthi tithi of Shukla Paksha. The last day of the 10-day celebrations is marked as Ganesh Visarjan. On this day, devotees immerse several idols of Lord Ganesha in water.

Lord Ganesha is the god of wisdom, knowledge, prosperity and happiness. As per the legend, Maa Parvati created Lord Ganesha with sandalwood paste. It is believed that she left Lord Ganesha to guard the place while she was taking a bath. Since Lord Shiva was not present at this time, he did not know about this arrangement. When he returned, he was surprised to find Lord Ganesha outside the place where Maa Parvati was taking a bath.

When Lord Ganesha did not allow Lord Shiva to enter the place he was furious and severed Ganesha's head. Maa Parvati was infuriated to see this and took the Kaali avatar while threatening to end the world. After finding the truth, Lord Shiva requested his men to fetch the head of a child whose mother was looking the other way. His men returned with the head of a baby elephant and gave it to Ganesha. That's how Lord Ganesha came to be known as the elephant-headed god.

Ganesh Chaturthi holds immense spiritual and cultural significance for Hindus. Lord Ganesha, the son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati, is believed to bless his devotees with wisdom, success, and good fortune. Devotees seek Lord Ganesha's blessings before starting any work, exam, wedding or job.

The Ganesh idol was worshipped in the college for three days (September 18th to 20th) as part of Ganesh Chaturthi. There were bhajans and various other programs by the students on three days.

On the third day, the festival ended with Ganesha Visarjana in the evening. Worshippers immersed Ganesha idols in the water with heavy hearts wishing that Baba would return next year. All of the Amrita family chanted 'Ganapati Bapa Morya, Purchya Varshi Laukaria' during the immersion.



She is a guru and a giver and is sincerely protective of her "children", who come to her seeking her blessings and love. A truly global figure now, she has been invited by nations and international organisations to share her wisdom. The Parliament of the World's Religions chose her as one of three presidents of Sanatana Dharma in 1993.

Amma embraces people with the purpose of giving protection, taking away their misery and grief, and spreading the message of love and care. She is available to everyone and no one is turned away. Amma has been known to embrace over 20,000 people in a day, giving darshan for over 22 hours. Upholding the ancient Indian tradition of charity, Amma's ashram is involved in multiple humanitarian activities, spanning areas such as healthcare, education, social welfare, and the environment. Mata Amritanandamayi Math has been actively involved in helping victims of natural disasters. The ashram also runs a vast network of educational institutions. Today, as we celebrate her birthday, it's hard to ignore her contributions to humanity in general, the impact she has had on people, the difference she made to the lives of the poor, and the stature she attained through selfless love, service, and compassion.

It is practically tradition for her to not celebrate her birthday. Instead, she uses the occasion to launch new humanitarian projects, including empowerment of women and free surgeries. She personally conducted the marriage of fifty-four couples. Having discovered that they could not afford to marry, she ensured that they would be given all that was necessary to do so. This included clothes, jewelleries and so on.

She also found time to address the world. Knowing that the world is in a state of strife, she implored people to protect the environment. She, along with international dignitaries, planted a sandalwood tree using soil from around the world.

The students and faculties of Amrita were not exempt from this gesture of goodwill either. Over a thousand students and faculties were invited to participate in several acts of charity. Taking Amma as an example, they performed social services. The services included cleaning the streets, serving food to people and so on.


Amma was honored with the 'World Leader for Peace and Security Award' by Hon. Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi and several Union Ministers.

## **OPEN AI WORKSHOP**

#### 1ST DECEMBER, 2023

On December 1st, 2023, the Robotics Club organized a dynamic workshop on Open AI at Acharya Hall. Dr. Ram Mohan delivered an insightful introductory address on the Robotics Club and the upcoming OpenAI workshop. The inauguration ceremony, attended by distinguished Dean Dr. Sasangan Ramanathan, featured an inspiring speech, adding an intellectual dimension to the event and enriching the experience for participants.

The Robotics Club showcased their technical prowess by developing an attendance monitoring system using Java and Python codes with the assistance of Raspberry Pi. This innovative system involved students scanning QR codes for entry and exit during the workshop. In the initial hour, Dr. Premjith delved into an extensive exploration of Large Language Models (LLMs), unraveling the intricacies of probability calculations and delivering a concise introduction to encoder and decoder architecture. The discussion covered pivotal topics such as big data and language models, accompanied by illustrative examples.

Distinguished guest speaker Dr. Ranga Srinivas Ganti offered profound insights into the application of OpenAI within industrial sectors, emphasizing the crucial role of token keys. Following this, Dr. Shanmugapriya and Ms. Bindu presented a comprehensive overview of Natural Language Processing (NLP) and Understanding (NLU). They shared valuable insights into the functionality of chatboxes and intricately detailing the LLM models employed by Google, ChatGPT and BERT. Additionally, participants gained knowledge on crafting personalized chatboxes utilizing LLM.













The afternoon session, facilitated by Dr. Ranga Srinivas Ganti, took the form of an interactive workshop where participants were organized into groups of four and presented with four intriguing problem statements. Each group leveraged ChatGPT 4.0 to solve problems, including converting unstructured data into structured data, generating a Digital Marketing Strategy Book, developing a Full Stack Software for Question and Answering, and using various APIs to retrieve results from Google and Wikipedia.

The workshop concluded with the presentation of solutions to the problem statements, emphasizing the creation of chatbots and full-stack development utilizing LLMs. The event deepened participants' understanding of OpenAI and provided practical insights into its industrial applications, NLP, NLU, and hands-on experience in deploying LLMs for various tasks. Before concluding, valuable feedback was collected from attendees, ensuring continuous improvement and refinement for future workshops conducted by the Robotics Club.


