RULES AND DESCRIPTION

FINE ARTS

1) On the Spot Painting

- a) Duration: 2 hours and 30 minutes.
- b) A2 sheets will be provided to the Participants.
- c) Participants should bring their own painting tools.
- d) Theme will be given on the spot.

2) Cooking without Fire and Wire

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Two members per team.
- c) Maximum three items can be prepared and displayed.
- d) The recipe should be prepared without any cooking using fire or wire.
- e) Participants should bring the necessary ingredients.
- f) For ex. creative sandwiches, sprouts salads, chats etc.
- g) Fresh and nutritious combinations are encouraged.

3) Art from Waste

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Maximum Two members per team.
- c) For arrangements, space will be provided.
- d) The topic will be given on the spot.
- e) Material should be brought by the participants themselves.

4) Clay Modelling

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Maximum Two members per team.
- c) Clay will be provided.
- d) Theme will be given on the spot.
- e) Participants should bring their own tools.

5) Rangoli

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Individual Event.
- c) 3' X 3' space will be provided, drawing beyond the area will be disqualified.
- d) Only color powder should be used; salt is banned.
- e) Participants should bring the necessary material.



6) Pencil Sketching

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Charts will be provided to the participants.
- c) Participants should bring their own drawing tools.
- d) Theme will be given on the spot.

7) On the Spot Photography with Caption

- a) Duration: 3 hours (to shoot and submit the soft copy).
- b) Each Participant may submit a maximum of 5 entries.
- c) Mobile Cameras are not allowed.
- d) Participants should format the camera at the venue before the start of the event.
- e) Participants should bring their own digital camera of not more than 12 MP.
- f) Theme will be given on the spot.
- g) No mixing, matching or morphing of photographs will be permitted.
- h) Software (Ex: Photoshop) for enhancing images is not permitted.

8) Poster Making

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Students have to bring their own laptop.
- c) Theme will be given on the spot.

9) Mehandi

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Individual Event.
- c) Participants can bring a friend to design on his/her hand.
- d) Participant should bring the necessary material.
- e) It can be black/red/Arabic mehandi etc.

- a) Duration: 2 hours.
- b) Two members per team.
- c) A list of items to be brought will be given at the start of the event.



LITERARY

1) Debate (English)

- a) Duration (Prelims): 3 minutes.
- b) Duration (Finals): 5 minutes.
- c) Topic will be given 24 hours in advance (Check Intranet / Instagram Page).
- d) Lots will used to decide FOR and AGAINST amongst the participant.

- a) Duration (Prelims): 3 minutes.

- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 5 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- e) Presentation may be in Carnatic / Hindustani Style.

2) Instrumental Non-Percussion Solo (Classical)

- a) Duration: 10 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 5 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- e) Presentation may be in Carnatic / Hindustani Style.

3) Instrumental Non-Percussion Solo (Classical)

- a) Duration: 10 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 5 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- e) Presentation may be in Western.

4) Classical Vocal Solo (Carnatic/Hindustani)

- a) Duration: 10 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 5 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Film songs are not allowed.

5) Light Vocal Solo

- a) Duration: 4-8 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 2 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Participants must bring their own instruments.



6) Western Vocal Solo

- a) Duration: 4-8 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 2 minutes.
- c) Maximum accompanist: 2
- d) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- e) Song must be in English only.

7) Group Song (Indian)

- a) Duration: 7 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 2 minutes.
- c) Maximum number of singers and accompanists: 9
- d) A team may present a maximum of two full songs, unless a medley is presented.
- e) Songs maybe folk or patriotic.
- f) Songs may be in any regional language.
- g) Participants must bring their own instruments.

8) Group Song (Western)

- a) Duration: 7 minutes (including set up time).
- b) Maximum set up time allowed is 2 minutes.
- c) Maximum number of singers and accompanists: 9
- d) A team may present a maximum of two full songs, unless a medley is presented.
- e) Song must be in English only.
- f) Lyrics must be decent and preserve the overall decorum.
- g) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- **♦** Accompanist need not be from the same House. However their performance will not count in the evaluation.
- **❖** Prior Approval of Songs must be obtained from the judges for performing in Finals (If selected from Prelims).
- **Lyrics** of the songs must be decent and preserve the overall decorum.



DANCE

1) Classical Dance Solo

- a) Duration: 10 minutes.
- b) Maximum three accompanists are permissible.
- c) Props and stage settings are allowed (no additional time for setup).
- d) Copy of the song should be submitted at the time of prelims (In a Pendrive).

2) Group Dance - Indian and Contemporary

- a) Duration: 10 minutes.
- b) 4-10 Members per team.
- c) Each student can perform only in one group.
- d) Props and stage settings are allowed (no additional time for set up).
- e) Vulgarity on stage will lead to disqualification.
- f) Copy of the song should be submitted at the time of prelims (In a Pendrive).

3) Split Sync Dance (Free Style)

- a) Duration: 3-5 minutes.
- b) Two members per team.
- c) A screen will be placed between the two dancers.
- d) Judging is based on the synchronicity and innovation of the dance moves.
- **Prior Approval of Songs must be obtained from the judges for performing in Finals (If selected from Prelims).**
- **Extra members (exceeding 10) in the form of props will not be entertained.**
- **Lyrics** of the songs must be decent and preserve the overall decorum.
- **Opy of the songs will be accepted only in pendrive and not by any other means.**



THEATRE

1) Skit/Drama (Topic: Problems of Nuclear Family)

- a) Duration: 10 minutes.
- b) Maximum Number of Participants: 8 (on stage).
- c) Team should register along with the topic/theme at the venue of prelims/finals.
- d) Skit play in five languages English, Hindi, Malayalam, Tamil and Telugu may be presented (all the plays will be evaluated together).
- e) StoryBoard/Synopsis to be submitted by the fixed date.
- f) No pre-recorded conversations.

2) Mime (Topic: Save Mother Earth - Role of Youth)

- a) Duration: 8 minutes.
- b) Maximum Number of Participants: 6 (on stage).
- c) Team should register along with the topic/theme at the venue of prelims/finals.
- d) Face painting is a must.
- e) StoryBoard/Synopsis to be submitted by the fixed date.
- f) No pre-recorded conversations.
- g) Music should not be dominant/jarring.

3) Short Film (Genre: Comedy [OR] Theme: Solution for menace of cellphone addiction)

- a) Maximum Duration: 10 minutes.
- b) The film can be shot in any language (if in a vernacular, English subtitles are mandatory).
- c) The film should be shot only inside the campus.
- d) StoryBoard/Synopsis to be submitted by the fixed date.
- e) The synopsis should get prior approval from the staff coordinators.
- f) Permission for shooting to be obtained from the Dept. of Students Welfare.
- g) Shortlisted scripts will be allowed for final filming.

4) Adzap

- a) Duration: 5 minutes.
- b) Maximum 5 Members per team.
- c) Must be in English.
- d) Topic will be given on the spot.



5) Mono Acting

- a) Duration(Prelims): 3 minutes.
- b) Duration(Finals): 3 6 minutes.
- c) Performance can be in English, Hindi, Malayalam, Tamil and Telugu.
- **Avoid including politics in the script.**
- **Script must be decent and preserve the overall decorum.**
- ♦ Final Submission Dates and Topics for Theatre Events will be announced through Intranet and Amritotsavam Instagram Page.

NOTE FOR THE PRELIMS

- 1. Only the participant is allowed to perform in the venue during the prelims.
- 2. Time limit should be strictly followed for the prelims.
- 3. Participants must wear their ID cards during the prelims and Those who fail to wear their ID cards will be disqualified.
- 4. The entire prelim events are scheduled to start sharp at 4:40 pm. Delayed entries will not be entertained
- 5. Participants are not permitted to interact with the judges or staff event coordinators before or after the event.
- 6. Any doubts regarding the event should be clarified through the CC, student event coordinators.
- 7. First year students who are registering for these events and those who have yoga classes should inform the Department of Students Welfare before the day of the competition, you may be provided with alternate classes.

Note: Judging criteria is only a guideline. The judges are at liberty to change them, if they feel so. Judge's decision will be final and binding.



GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR CULTURAL EVENTS

- 1. Students are requested to provide their proper bank details, while registering, if not they'll be disqualified while prelims.
- 2. Students should *represent only their own House*.
- 3. In Group Events namely Group Music, Theatre Events, Quiz mixing of Boys & Girls may be allowed if necessary. In other events, mixing of boys and girls is NOT ALLOWED.
- 4. Finalists will be selected purely on their performance during prelims. Hence, representation of all the Houses in the finals is **not MANDATORY**.
- 5. For Events the first and second prizes will be given. The third prizes will carry only certificates.
- 6. In case of team swapping, the lending team secretary will sign a declaration form and hand it over to the Department of Student's Welfare through the Organizing Students Committee.
- 7. The Organizing Student's Committee members will ensure that there is no *mixing up of Houses. If any mixing up comes to our notice, 15 points will be deducted* from the total points gained by that particular House and it will be disqualified for the particular event.
- 8. The Secretaries and Joint Secretaries should try to find out the talented students and motivate them to participate in the various events. The House that scores the maximum points will win the trophy.
- 9. Any *issues to be discussed* from the students' or office bearer's side should be brought *to the Dept. of Student's Welfare through the* Organizing Students Committee *members*.
- 10. *House Secretaries* or the participants are *not supposed to meet the judges* directly or indirectly. Hence they will be intimated about the appointment of judges only at the final moment.
- 11. High tech sound and light equipment must be avoided as they interfere with the exhibition of the creative talents of the students.
- 12. No professional training (choreography) for dances / acting / music is allowed. The students should use the opportunities to create and innovate by themselves as intrusion of professionals robs the freshness of their creations / talents.
- 13. Themes / concepts / episodes may be taken from our traditional regional folklores.
- 14. Dance dramas may depict incidents from the lives of great people like Tagore / Meera / Gandhi / our epic personages.
